A bishop, though more famous from his time before ordination - as a soldier, he cut his cloak in half to share it with a beggar. St Martin's generosity and empathy is an example to us all. His legacy also gave us the words 'chaplain' and 'chapel'. A prayer of St Martin (perhaps unsurprisingly, with a military feel) Lord, if Your people still have need of my services, I will not avoid the toil. Your will be done. I have fought the good fight long enough. Yet if You bid me continue to hold the battle line in defense of Your camp, I will never beg to be excused from failing strength. I will do the work You entrust to me. While You command, I will fight beneath Your banner. Amen	 Author of many of the books of the New Testament, and famous for changing from Saul, persecutor of Christians, to Paul, one of the most important figures in the Early Church. The story of St Paul demonstrates to us that 'neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulersnor anything else in all creation will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. (<i>Romans 8.38-39</i>) His is also a legacy that draws us closer to God, and encourages us to see that unending love for us that we find in God: May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.
